



MWDI MĀORI BUSINESSWOMEN'S AWARDS 2024

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. A business/individual can nominate themselves or be nominated by any member of the public.
2. Entry in the MWDI Māori Businesswomen's Awards is free.
3. Entries must be a business owned by a woman of Māori descent (sole or joint ownership accepted), that has been operating for more than 12 months.
4. Nominations are open from **Monday, 1 July 2024 till midnight Monday, 22 July 2024** and may only be made using the official nomination form submitted online at <https://mwdi.co.nz/awards24/>
5. Unsuccessful nominees and successful category winners from previous years may re-nominate in subsequent years.
6. A business/individual may be nominated in more than one category if appropriate, but can only move through to be celebrated (as a Finalist/Winner) in one regional category and up to two business categories.
7. The MWDI Awards Office reserves the right to enter nominations in additional award categories as deemed appropriate. Every effort will be made to inform nominators and nominees of this.
8. It is permissible to contact the MWDI Awards Office for guidance and support during the compilation of a nomination. Please call 04 499 6504 or email awards@mwdi.co.nz
9. All information submitted by the nominator or nominee will be kept by Māori Women's Development Inc. (MWDI) exclusively for the purpose of administering and judging the MWDI Māori Businesswomen's Awards. All personal data will be handled with the utmost confidentiality and will not be shared with any third parties. All information collected by MWDI is used, managed and stored in accordance with the Privacy Act 2020.
10. Nominators understand that they and the nominee(s) may be contacted by the MWDI Awards Office for further information and/or for publicity purposes.



11. Those selected as Finalists should be available to attend the Awards Dinner in Pōneke, Te Whanganui-A-Tara; on Friday, 25 October 2024 (Inability to attend does not disqualify entry).
12. Entrants are required to submit a completed nomination form along with the appropriate documentation, which must include financial statements, annual accounts, or audited accounts.
13. The winner of the **“Te Kaipakihi tino Taumata”** (Supreme Award winner) will be chosen by the judges from entries in the Business categories only.
14. Finalists and winners of all categories will be announced at the Awards Gala dinner on **Friday, 25 October 2024.**
15. At the Judge’s discretion, two winners may be awarded in a category and/or any other special commendations awarded where deemed appropriate.
16. Any business owned by a sponsor can enter any category they are normally eligible to enter excluding the category which they sponsor.
17. Entrants must disclose any issues that could potentially compromise the integrity of the MWDI Māori Businesswomen’s Awards or threaten the continuity of their business in the subsequent year. These issues may include, but are not limited to, legal actions, changes in legislation, potential loss of funding, or any other significant risks.
18. All entrants must agree to reasonably participate in publicity around the Awards that has been organised by MWDI, and as requested by the category sponsor.
19. Entrants may utilise consultants or external assistance in preparing their entries; however, such providers must not be present during any part of the judging process.
20. All entries will be treated with strict confidentiality. Judges are required to sign a confidentiality agreement, prohibiting them from disclosing any information related to entrants outside of the judging process.
21. Judges will not participate in the judging of any organisations where they are a Shareholder, Director or Employee, or where an actual or potential conflict of interest arises.

22. Judges will not participate in the judging of any other entrants in a category where they are conflicted as above.
23. By accepting these conditions you also agree to Māori Women's Development Inc (MWDI) to use your photo/video as follows:

24. Winners of each category will be presented with an award to keep. The winner of each Regional Category will receive \$2,500 in prize money. Similarly, each Business Category winner will be awarded \$2,500. The overall winner, 'Te Kaipakihi Tino Taumata', will receive a prize of \$10,000.
25. The Judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
26. The MWDI Awards Office reserves the right to make reasonable amendments to these Conditions of Entry at any point in time.
